ISTE recently launched a new Second Life property, ISTE Island 2, and has begun renting space to educators. This new island, attached directly to the original ISTE Island, provides a community for ISTE-affiliated organizations and other educational groups to collaborate, network with stakeholders, and build a customized space in Second Life.

A variety of community resources are available for tenants, including a shared auditorium, periodic tutorial sessions led by fellow educators, and small-group meeting areas. Tapping into ISTE's active network of educators working in Second Life, island residents have access to experienced educational leaders in virtual worlds, including two island managers and ISTE's volunteer docent corps.
